The Mission of Mentor Me is to connect young people to trusted adults and role models that provide opportunities for children and youth to reach their full potential. But the truth is when we are helping them, they are actually helping us reach our full potential.



OUR PROGRAMS

One-to-One Mentoring

- · Served 55 children & youth
- · Engaged 58 community volunteers
- Provided 2,860 one-to-one mentoring hours

OVERVIEW

Our One-to-One mentoring program has matched over **600** mentors and mentees. The program has demonstrated impactful outcomes for youth participants, influencing various aspects of their lives.

IMPACT

Here are a few examples illustrating the positive effects of one-to-one mentoring, as reported by mentee guardians:

· Confidence/self-esteem improvements: 100%

Social skills improvements: 76%

Mental Health Improvements: 68%

Mentoring After School (MAS)

- · Served 250 elementary students
- · Engaged 265 volunteers as mentors
- 84% of mentors are high school students
- Provided 3,182 mentoring hours and service opportunities from volunteers
- · Offered 4 summer MAS programs

MAS LOCATIONS

Browns Bridge Church (summer), Chattahoochee Elementary School, Chestatee Elementary School, Cumming Library (summer), Forsyth Central High School, Midway Elementary School, Post Road Library (summer), Sawnee Elementary School

OVERVIEW

The MAS Program exhibits progress in student academic and literacy skills, increased classroom participation, and noticeable improvements in social skills, as reported by both teachers and parents. Our approach by requesting additional homework assignments from teachers and identifying specific skills requiring assistance at program locations, allows the organization to tailor the students' learning experiences.

Improvements reported by parents:

Confidence/Self-esteem improvements: 89%

Social skills improvements: 78%

Better academic performance in school: 90%

OVERVIEW

Connect Clubs offer invaluable support and opportunities, fostering team-building activities that promote healthy connections, personal development, and overall improvement in behavior and social skills. School administrative staff report increased classroom participation, improved behaviors, better attendance, and sustained academic progress as key indicators of success.

IMPACT

- Confidence/Self-esteem improvements: 90%
- Social and emotional well-being improvements: 75%
- Better academic performance in school: 79%
